What's new at ReSkilled?

This has been an encouraging few months (since our Spring newsletter)! We have seen more volunteering in a variety of roles and welcomed several new participants to ReSkilled.

In terms of projects, we have been making a range of commissions and products of participants' own design. We are currently part way through making a toy car garage (like the Fisher Price ones, but in wood and better?!) for a pre-school, which has taken a lot of planning and thinking in 3D. We also had to install a new fire door in the workshop premises, which provided a great opportunity to work on a different scale.

In supporting participants more broadly where appropriate, we helped one person by ordering and assembling an adult tricycle that they needed to improve their mobility. They can now access shops, the doctor and the chemist much more easily, hopefully exploring further as time and confidence allow!

Progress

Over the last 3 months, we have had three of our participants move on to volunteering (and therefore finish at ReSkilled)! A fourth is currently volunteering and expects to move on soon. It is a joy to see each person move on, having progressed in confidence whilst at ReSkilled and willingly taken up a volunteering role as their next move forwards.

We find that each day of the week in the workshop has its own "flavour" as the specific combination of volunteer and participants develops, sharing experiences and interests, developing projects and techniques, times of testing as the wood reveals its inconsistencies, all combining to provide a relaxed and supportive atmosphere every day.

Each person will have been with us for a year or more, although it doesn't feel like it. Time passes quickly: projects are made and sold; commissioned pieces very gratefully received; wide and varied conversations (!) taking place every day; and participants attending very consistently.

Whilst one of our criteria to attend is "having been unemployed for over 12 months", in reality most of our participants have been out of work for an average of nearer 7 years. We therefore often provide a wider range of support than expected and it is a privilege to be able to help. Continuity is important.

Wooden Products

We continue to appreciate the wide range of projects being made at ReSkilled, whether for the participant themselves or as a commission. We frequently see finished pieces of high quality, satisfying to both the maker and receiver, building confidence and a deserved sense of pride in their achievements.

Getting the word out

As we have been aware that we need to keep finding new ways of reaching new participants - those who might not naturally be attracted to engage with "another agency" - we decided to step out in September and have a gazebo space outside Guildford's Tesco Superstore, located on the other side of town. We did get some interest and hope that this will bear fruit.

On the same day, we had a market stall at All Saints, Onslow Village, which was very successful! Not only did we sell a range of our products but were made very welcome by the hosts, being invited to share more details about ReSkilled through their local magazine.

We have also been recommended to pursue greater Facebook presence, as this will reach people within their own homes - particularly helpful for those who have limited reasons to go out.



Also in September, Piers had been invited to give a presentation to JobCentre Plus clients to tell them what ReSkilled was and how we could help. Half of those present wanted to follow up and visit the workshop, two of whom started at ReSkilled within a fortnight and two more are still interested.

The next day, we attended an event to which multiple caring/support agencies had been invited by a Guildford GP practice, with the aim of showcasing opportunities to which individuals could be signposted/referred in addition to receiving GPs' medical help. ReSkilled was noted for being a practical way of helping people to move on, adopt routine and interact with others.

In other words, it's been a busy time of broadening our reach to tell as many people as possible what ReSkilled has to offer. We know that our encouragement, practical approach, consistent and sustained support, combined with helping participants into volunteering (or paid/self-employed work) really makes a difference and we will continue to help as many people as possible - it's still hard reaching the "hard-to-reach"!

Supporting ReSkilled

In May, Piers completed his 2nd Triathlon, raising £570 for ReSkilled. Thank you to all who supported him! He's planning on doing the 3 Peak Challenge at some point in the future - watch this space...
